PSYCHOMETRIC QUALITIES

- Standards: The Watson-Glaser was validated in 2022 with a normative sample of 3433 adults in various positions.
- Fidelity: Test-retest correlation coefficients range from 0.73 to 0.89, meaning that test results are stable over time (3-month interval).
- Validity: Correlation coefficients between the Watson-Glaser results and those of other reasoning tests range from 0.48 to 0.70 (convergent validity).
